KY New Skills for Youth



- **New Skills for Youth (NSFY) grant initiative**
 - Collaboration of the Council of Chief State School Officers (CCSSO), JP Morgan Chase, and Advance CTE
 - JP Morgan Chase 5-year, \$75 million program to connect students to high-skill, high-demand careers.
- **24 states & Washington, D.C. in Phase 1**
- **10 states, including Kentucky, in Phase 2**

- **Provides industry certifications and credentials recognized by business and industry**



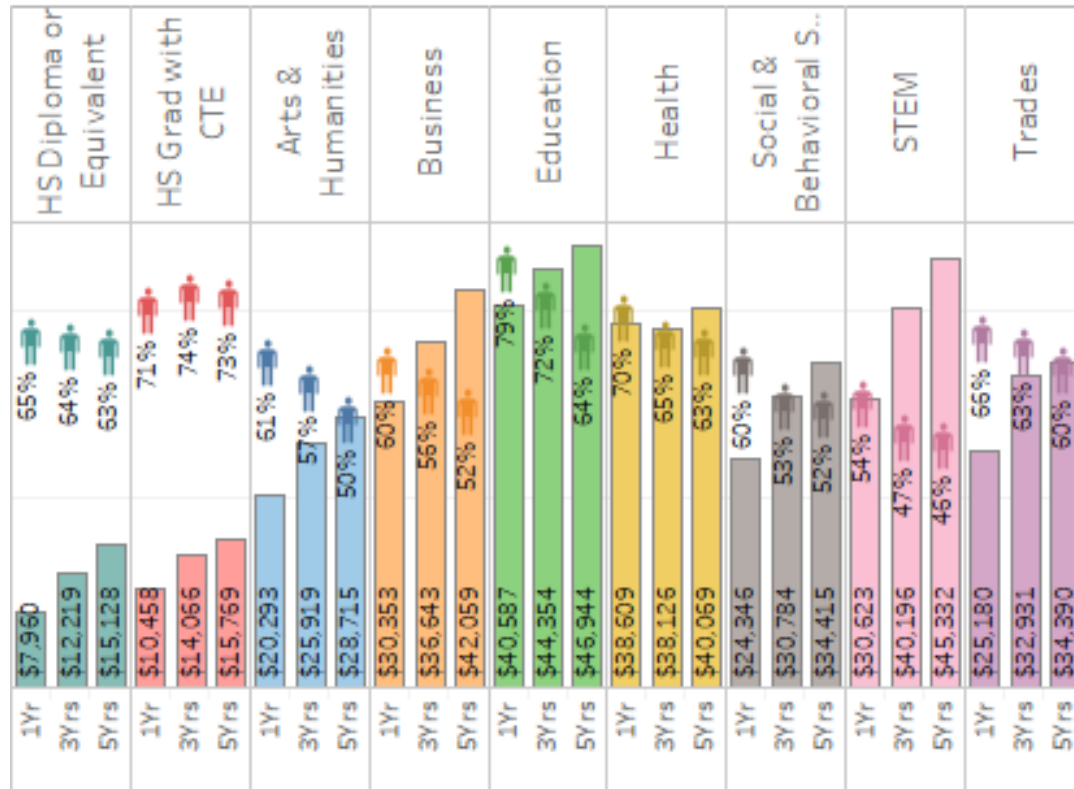
