

Process occurs annually, with additions/changes considered by the Kentucky Workforce Innovation Board (KWIB) on a quarterly basis (workgroup to meet 6-8 weeks prior to quarterly KWIB meetings, when necessary).

1. Uniform submission process

 - KWIB will distribute recommendations to local WIBs
3. KWIB send to OCTE
 - Consultants review with BEAT team

There are no changes to state accountability for the 2025-2026 school year. There are five (5) options for meeting career readiness:

1. [Industry Certification\(s\)](#) (with an extra 0.25 points in accountability for those identified as high demand)
2. [End-of-Program Assessment](#) (for articulated credit)
3. [CTE Dual Credit](#) (a minimum of 3 hours and a grade of “C” or higher)
4. [Co-op or Internships](#) (a minimum of 300 on-the-job hours with a passing grade)
5. [TRACK](#): Tech Ready Apprentices for Careers in Kentucky Certificate

Industry Certification Process

7 KRS 158.6455 establishes the process used to determine which industry certifications are recommended for the list and the level of demand for certifications on the list. In order to be considered "industry-recognized,"

8 certifications must go through a verification process. KY Stats works with each local workforce investment board to give job and demand data for the region.

9 Local workforce investment boards work with local economic development organizations and business to compile a list of industry-recognized certifications, licensures, and credentials, ranked by demand for that region.

10 The lists are then given to the Kentucky Workforce Innovation Board (KWIB). Finally, the KWIB and KDE work together to edit and refine the list before KDE disseminates to all school districts. This work is done to ensure

11 industry-recognized credentials are practical, relevant, and that they align with career pathways. The attached list is based on information provided by local workforce investment boards (WIBs), reviewed by multiple

12 business and industry groups, presented to the Kentucky Workforce Innovation Board (KWIB) Business and Education Alignment Committee and approved by the KWIB. Industry certifications identified as HIGH DEMAND

13 by KWIB will receive 1.25 in the state accountability model under Postsecondary Readiness versus 1.00 for all other certifications.

14 Certifications determined to be HIGH DEMAND by KWIB are highlighted and noted in the spreadsheet below.
